The advantages of Membership

- ▶ The opportunity to take part in camps, dinners and other social activities arranged within the Scout Fellowship for the enjoyment of its members.
- ▶ Uniformed or non-uniformed membership
- ▶ Not specifically attached to any one Section
- ▶ From 18 years onwards and beyond the age of 65 (when those holding warranted positions must retire)
- ▶ A chance to use your particular skill or interest, without involvement in general activities.
- ▶ Training is available, if required, in your own time, and as much or as little as you demand
- ▶ Insurance cover whilst on Scouting activities.
- ▶ National, County/Area activities on some occasions if you wish; not just confined to local activities.
