

- 1. Ask the young people to draw a grid of 4x4 (4 boxes across and 4 boxes down = 16 in total)
- 2. Ask the young people to select 16 of the Christmas related items below, and write them into their grids: The list is also on the next page if you wish to share your screen instead of reading out all of the list.
 - Santa
 - Sleigh
 - Reindeer
 - Christmas lights
 - Presents
 - Christmas Tree
 - Carols
 - Mince Pies
 - Pigs in Blankets
 - Turkey
 - Advent Calendar
 - Candy Cane
 - Christmas Day

- 3. The bingo game can involve 1 row/column first, and then a full house (basic bingo rules apply but you many want to explain these to younger children to ensure they know what they are doing).
- 4. Once everyone has chosen, randomly read out items on the list until someone has a row/column.
- 5. Once someone has done this, move on to a full house
- 6. You can repeat this game as many times as you want (we would suggest 3 times is a good amount).
- 7. As a prize, you may want to get the winner to be able to be the bingo master next time around, and you yourself can play.
- 8. Why not try it with a range of activities and ask your young people to fill their grids with their favourites. This will give you some quick and easy feedback on their preferred activities!
