Dates for your diary

We're going to be running two webinars for **ALL** participants to join on **23rd March** and **8th June**.

Starting at 7:30pm and lasting no more than an hour, it will be the perfect opportunity to learn more about the Jamboree and ask any burning questions.

We'll be in touch with the joining instructions nearer the event and we hope this will really start the countdown to what is going to be an epic 'Alps22 Jamboree in the Mountains'!

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Is your passport valid for entry into France?

We know our passports have been feeling a bit left out over the past two years. They may be lurking in a dusty drawer or at the back of the filing cabinet, thinking they'll never see the light of day again.

But dust off those bad boys because you're going to need them in a few months' time. To make sure yours is still valid for travel to France, here are some important things to remember:

For British passport holders, your passport must meet 2 requirements. Your passport must be:

- less than 10 years old on the day you enter (check the 'date of issue')
- valid for at least 3 months after the day you plan to leave (check the 'expiry date')

The guidance at the moment is that your passport will need to be less than 10 years old during your whole visit, and the 'valid for 3 months after you have left France' may also need to be within 10 years of your passport's **issue date**.

Check both the **issue date** and the **expiry date** in your passport. If you renewed your passport early, extra months may have been added to its expiry date. This could affect the requirement for your passport to be less than 10 years old.

If you have a non-British passport, please check the Government travel advice to see which specific requirements apply to you: <u>https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice/france/entry-requirements</u>

And if you don't yet have a passport, or it has expired, what are you waiting for? We'd encourage you to get your passport application in **ASAP** as the Passport Office is likely to be busier than normal this year and we'd hate to have to leave anyone behind :(



European and Global Health Insurance Cards

All participants for Alps22 will need to have a valid UK EHIC or GHIC card to gain access to emergency medical cover overseas.

Please note that under 16s will need to be included on their parents' application, but will be provided with their own card.

Vaccination update



The vaccination requirements for France are still subject to change, but this is what we know right now:

Fully vaccinated travellers aged 12 and over must provide:


- Proof of vaccination. For under 18s you will need to have had two doses and for over 18s it includes the requirement to have a booster.
- A <u>sworn statement</u> (déclaration sur l'honneur) self-certifying you're not suffering from COVID-19 symptoms and haven't been in contact with confirmed cases in the 14 days prior to travel.
- If you are over 18 and your second jab was more than 9 months ago on the day of travel, but you've not received a booster, you will have to follow the rules for unvaccinated travellers, which includes taking a PCR test! If you are able to, please get your booster now. There are plenty of walk-in vaccination centres, so you don't even need to make an appointment.

Spotlight on Guillestre



Situated just over 8km south of Saint-Crépin, lies the pretty mountain village of Guillestre, which you'll be able to visit on one of our cultural excursions during the Jamboree.

One of the main landmarks is the imposing 16th century Notre-Dame d'Aquilon church, also built using that gorgeous pink marble.


