History	The Michael Nightingale Community Fund is named in the memory of Michael Nightingale, former County Chair, who made a substantial positive impact on his community.
Funding	The original funding was from a donation in memory of Michel Nightingale.
	The fund is open to other donations or any additional funds allocated to it at the discretion of the CEC on an ad hoc basis.
Managers of Fund	Simon Pickett (Chair), CYC or DCYC, County Treasurer (any two to agree funding)
Details	 Support can take various forms: Advice on sources of external funding to support the proposed activity; Advice on making an impact in their community; A loan to help launch the activity; Provision of funds to support an activity.
Funding Criteria	 The proposed activity must involve young people; The young people must be involved in shaping the activity; Where appropriate the activity is part of a programme of the Community Award; After or during the activity, photographs and stories related to the activity are posted on the Berkshire Scouts Website using the 'Scouts in Action' feature.
Restrictions	No other restrictions
Funding decision	At the discretion of the Fund Managers, based on the criteria above
Application process	Applications for support can be made at any time by email to grants@berkshirescouts.org.uk The Application should not contain more than 300 words and should contain: The contact details (email, phone) for the person leading the activity; Indicate how young people are involved in the activity; Details of the activity; A description of what the money will be spent on.
