Participant/Leader Day – 14 May

Key points made in the briefing included:

headline numbers are good for both adults and young people;

the day was a great start in building the unit with great teamwork (getting to know each other – we all need to support each other!);



good discussions on youth shaped, top awards, and fundraising;

outlined where we are with plan B – working hard and trying our best to find an appropriate alternative country;

possible option being investigated in Botswana – although cost is a challenge; given ourselves until end June to find an alternative – after that date we run out of time; first deposit of £300 due around end of June; safety, welfare, and wellbeing arrangements explained;

some discussion on fundraising options; all encouraged to keep up-to-date through Facebook and web page (see links below); a reminder of the importance of attending future events.
