Malawi

Following months of research, including contact with many international charities and Scouting connections, the decision has been taken that Malawi is the country of choice for the next phase of Project Africa.



Malawi is rated the 8th safest country in sub-Sarahan Africa (Global Peace Index) which compares to Uganda being 28th in the same table. Malawi means 'fire flames'. The country takes its name from the reflection of the rising sun on the waters of the vast Lake Malawi.

The Republic of Malawi has an approximate population of 20 million people. The country is famed as the 'warm heart of Africa' for good reason: Malawi is known for its happy people, beautiful landscapes, and rich culture.

Malawi stretches about 520 miles (840 km) from north to south and varies in width from 5 to 100 miles (10 to 160 km). Lake Malawi covers a fifth of the country.

Malawi continued

Projects in Malawi will be very similar to those completed in the three previous visits to Uganda. The projects will take place in villages approximately 30–40 minutes from the second city of Blantyre. The in-country partner supporting projects is *Joshua Orphan & Community Care ('Joshua'*). We are also exploring a partnership with the Malawi Scout Association at their national campsite near the town of Zomba.

Joshua is a British charity working in the Blantyre area of Malawi. Established in 1998, the charity believes 'in giving children the best possible start in life through Early Child Development work'.

Stage payments

Stage 2: £600 – 30 September

Stage 3: £600 – 30 November

Stage 4: £600 – 30 January 2024

Stage 5: £600 - 30 March

Balance: £900 – 30 May

An invoice will be sent direct to participants and leaders for each stage payment above. The invoice will include payment method, eg: bank transfer details.
