Salut la gang! As we roll closer to Alps25, the tempo is picking up – and this edition brings a few key updates to keep us all in step.





Training requirements

We are very grateful for every volunteer who has signed up to help deliver such an amazing event for the young people attending. As part of the sign up we have explained the requirement for all adults – which includes all network attendees – whether leading activities, supporting logistics, or helping with pastoral care - to complete their required training. This may be additional training to what was required with previous roles. Those who held occasional helper or district or group supporter did not previously need complete any modules. Everyone is now a team member. Everyone attending the alps needs to complete their growing roots as soon as possible.





In addition to the training there is a requirement to agree and sign the declaration on the system (this is in addition to any other roles you already hold – every new role requires a further declaration). For some a welcome conversation needs to be held and recorded and you will be asked to provide 2 references (even if you have been a helper for many years).

Everyone is required to undertake the new safety training before 14th July even if you had completed it last September before the transition.

If you have any questions about any of this please reach out to the alps team, we will help identify what is needed and support you on the learning you need to complete.
